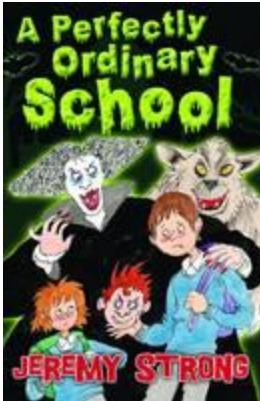

Dyslexia Friendly books 7-9 years

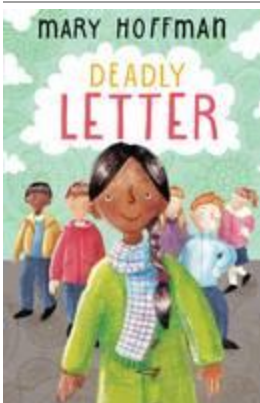

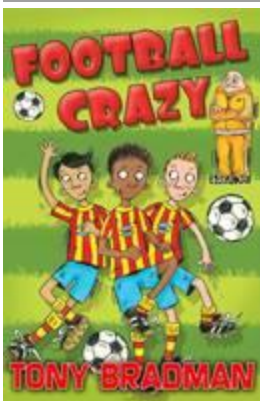
A Perfectly Ordinary School **Jeremy Strong**

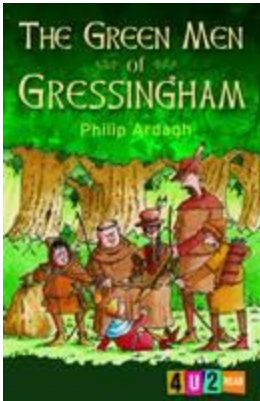
Football Crazy **Tony Bradman**

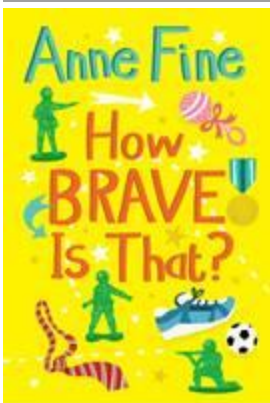
Gnomes Gnomes Gnomes!

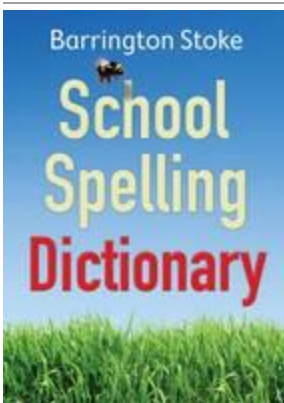
The Green Men of Gressingham

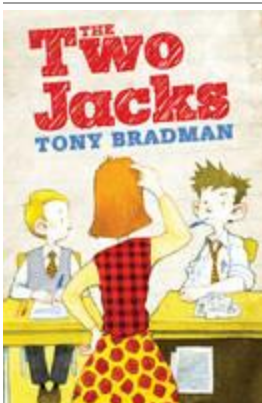
The Haunting of Uncle Ron

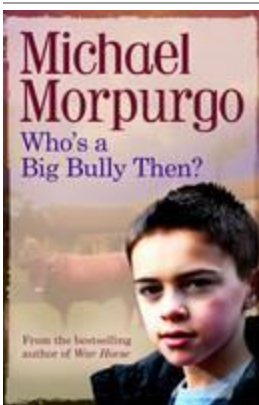
The Two Jacks
